Remains of Hadrian's Wall  10 points for each new bit of remains you spot – look for ruined sections of wall (about 1.5m wide) in fields in line with the road		
Roman stones re-used in modern buildings 20 points for each - look for small rectangular & square stones		
A village or town with 'Wall' as part of its name  10 points each e.g. Walwick, Wallhouses, Wallsend,  Wallsend,		
Roman Helmet symbols on brown tourist road signs 5 points each – there'll be more the closer you get to each site		
The World Heritage Site symbol		
30 points each – look on signs at the sites and on leaflets too		
Local businesses or places named after 'Hadrian'		
20 points each – look out for buildings or vehicles with company names on too		
The Vallum ditch, or the cliff ridge which follow the line of the Wall		
20 points each – runs parallel to the Wall		
Latin site names		
20 points each – often end in an 'a' or a 'm', e.g. Segedunum, Arbeia, Vercovicium or Alauna
