The edge of the Roman Empire... Hadrian's Wall Country

Britain's greatest Roman monument, Hadrian's Wall, was built on orders of the Emperor, to define and control the empire's northern edge - an empire that stretched across Europe, the Middle East and northern Africa. Evidence suggests Hadrian inspected work on the Wall in AD122. For almost 2,000 years, the Wall has stood as a symbol of power and might. Today Hadrian's Wall is part of the UNESCO World Heritage Site Frontiers of the Roman Empire, one of the largest in the world.

Were you coming from the north 2,000 years ago, you would have received a rather cool reception. Safe to say your welcome will be a lot warmer and friendlier nowadays.

For 80 miles, Hadrian's Wall stretches across northern England, from coast to coast, crossing dramatic countryside and cosmopolitan cities alike. Along its course you will find a wealth of Roman heritage, to explore and enjoy, in a variety of dynamic ways. Modern museums and galleries tell stories through state of the art interpretation and displays, archaeology in action with live digs and excavations, full scale reconstructions and re-enactments bringing the Roman frontier to life, and of course Roman remains, from parts of the Wall itself to precious treasures found in the World Heritage Site.

Hadrian's Wall Country has more: spectacular coastlines, breathtaking countryside, picturesque villages, short ambles or epic treks, easy bike rides or challenging cycles, things to see and do whatever the weather, and lovely places to stay, which when combined with the unique history and heritage, make for a super holiday.

This guide will provide you with an introduction to Hadrian's Wall Country, and help with your planning and booking. Please use it together with the 2014 **Hadrian's Wall Country Map** and the website **visithadrianswall.co.uk** and you'll have all you need for the perfect Roman holiday!



Arbeia Roman Fort & Museum



Overlooking the River Tyne at South Shields, Arbeia Roman Fort is an important part in the Hadrian's Wall story. Built around AD160, Arbeia was an active garrison that guarded the shipping routes to Hadrian's Wall and became the military supply base for its 17 Forts.

The museum, which celebrated its 60th year in 2013, houses some of the remains that have been found since excavations began in the late 1800's. There are impressive full-scale reconstructions at Arbeia, including the West Gate, the Commanding Officer's house and a barrack block. These reconstructions show the scale of Roman military architecture and highlight the very different living conditions of all ranks. Arbeia has one of the finest collections of finds from Roman Britain, and more objects are being uncovered each year, as archaeologists continue to excavate this fascinating site.

Segedunum Roman Fort, Baths & Museum



Segedunum - meaning 'Strong Fort' - was built to guard the eastern end of Hadrian's Wall, and once housed 600 Roman soldiers. It stood for almost 300 years as a symbol of Roman rule and a bastion against barbarian attack.

Now, Segedunum Roman Fort, Baths & Museum at Wallsend is the most excavated fort along Hadrian's Wall, where visitors can see foundations of many buildings and part of the Wall itself. Highlights of the museum include the only reconstructed Roman Bath House in the UK and a 35 metre high viewing tower providing outstanding views across this World Heritage Site.

Great North Museum: Hancock



The museum features a large scale interactive model of Hadrian's Wall and is Europe's only venue with objects from every major Roman site on the frontier.

Star objects include an inscription stone that provides conclusive proof that the Wall was built on the orders of Emperor Hadrian, unique carvings depicting the popular Roman god Mithras, and the gold Aemelia Ring - believed to be the earliest Christian artefact found in Roman Britain. Visitors can also add their name to a stone on a virtual Hadrian's Wall.

Corbridge Roman Town





Not all of the sites on the frontier were heavily guarded fortresses. Corbridge was a supply base and bustling town where the soldiers and civilians could pick up food and provisions. Visit today and you can see the military granaries and walk along a Roman high street. In the museum marvel at the remains of life in the Roman town. Perhaps the most famous find is the Corbridge Roman Hoard, a time capsule of information which contains armour, weapons and trinkets.

In 2014, Corbridge Roman Town celebrates the 50th anniversary of the Corbridge Hoard's discovery so it is the perfect time to come and discover what it can tell us about life on the frontier.

Chesters Roman Fort







Nestled in a beautiful riverside location, it's not hard to see why Chesters was a good spot for the Romans to set up a base. Our Museum houses a fascinating collection of finds from John Clayton, who was a keen Victorian antiquarian and 'saviour of the Wall'. If it wasn't for him, this ancient monument would not exist as it does today. See Roman belt buckles, shoes and a bronze bucket used to measure out a soldier's weekly grain allowance.

New for 2014: come and see the amazing Eagle created from the bronze coins discovered in Coventina's Well.

Housesteads is the most iconic of all the Wall sites. The views and Roman remains are spectacular. Delve into the Fort's story and see a stunning collection of artefacts. A CGI film flies through time and reconstructs Housesteads before your very eyes.

Get up close and personal with real Roman objects and marvel outside at the fort. It's one of the best preserved in the country with ancient draining and heating systems and latrines (aka communal toilets). You can't help but wonder; how did they build this? All the way up here? Almost 2000 years ago? It still amazes us every day.

Roman Vindolanda





Roman Vindolanda offers the visitor an award winning museum and the opportunity to explore the most exciting archaeological site in Europe. Vindolanda is home to the 'Vindolanda Writing Tablets', these small thin wooden letters were voted Britain's top treasure by the British Museum. A collection of these precious documents along with thousands of other extraordinary artefacts from everyday Roman life are displayed in the modern museum. Live excavations take place between April and September where visitors can watch history being uncovered. In addition visitors can enjoy the beautiful gardens and make use of the excellent tea room. Walking the Wall

To fully appreciate the staggering scale and engineering feat of Hadrian's Wall, try walking its entire length. Hugging the Wall from end to end, the Hadrian's Wall Path National Trail has been voted the nation's favourite. This unique Trail is best tackled during the summer months when the grassy path is at its most healthy and the impact of boots on sensitive archaeology underfoot is minimised. Please help by abiding to the Every Footstep Counts code of conduct. Thank you.

- Not walking on the Wall itself
- Take your litter home
- Follow signposted paths
- Walk side by side
- Keep gates closed
- Control your dog

Thank you. Every little bit helps



- Use public transport
- Support local businesses
- Consider circular walks and Roman site visits instead of the Trail
- Avoid worn patches on the Trail

There are also plenty of do-in-a-day (or shorter) walks that pepper Hadrian's Wall Country. Circular routes from car parks, linear routes linking with buses, guided and themed, there's bound to be something up your street, or country path.

Cycling the Wall

If you're eager to get pedalling, Hadrian's Wall Country will not disappoint. The 150-mile Hadrian's Cycleway will test your stamina as you ride quiet roads and bridleways following the Wall and down the Cumbrian coast. If a leisurely pace is more your thing, there are numerous country lane and cycle path-based routes that include Roman sites, pubs and tearooms along the way.

You don't even have to bring your own bikes. New hire centres in Maryport and Carlisle that can provide adult and children bikes to rent and routes to ride, and even electric bikes if you don't fancy pedaling all the time!

Getting around Hadrian's Wall



It's surprising how well connected Hadrian's Wall is.

There's easy access from the north and the south by train, either into Carlisle on the West Coast mainline and Newcastle on the East Coast mainline. An international airport and ferry terminal at Newcastle makes arriving from overseas simple too.

Getting round by public transport is a breeze once you're in Hadrian's Wall Country. The Hadrian's Wall Country Line train runs east west (and back again), linking Newcastle and Carlisle, and stopping at key towns and villages along the way. Supporting the trains is a network of local buses. One bus in particular, the AD122 (see the connection?), runs from spring to autumn, with a specially designed route linking train stations and local towns to Hadrian's Wall and the National Trail. Handy if you're walking the Wall and have tired feet.

The AD122 offers discounted and unlimited Rover travel tickets, so that you can hop on and off as many times as you like. You can even use your ticket on other buses. Order yours from **hadrianswallshop.co.uk**

Hotels
